DEPARTMENT**Exemption in respect of tax Payable by any dealer on the sale of Furnace Oil to industrial consumers registered under the Tamil Nadu Value Added Tax Act.**

No. II(2)/CTR/523/2009.—In exercise of the powers conferred by sub-sections (1) and (2) of Section 30 of the Tamil Nadu Value Added Tax Act, 2006 (Tamil Nadu Act 32 of 2006), the Governor of Tamil Nadu hereby makes an exemption in respect of the tax payable under the said Act by any dealer on the sale of furnace oil to industrial consumers registered under the said Act, for use in generation of electrical energy through captive generators, subject to production of a certificate every month, as appended to this Notification.

2. This Notification shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st April 2009 and shall remain in force upto and inclusive of the 30th September 2009.

In the Government Order first read above orders have been issued to refer the case in I.D.No.25/2007 on the file of the Labour Court, Salem.

2. The High Court, Madras in its Order 3rd read above ordered that the court is constrained to direct to consider the petitioner's representation dated 30th December 2008 and pass orders on merits and in accordance with the law.

3. The General Secretary of Bharat Technologies Auto Components Employees Union in his representation 2nd read above has requested the Government to transfer the case to the Principal Labour Court, Madras.

4. Accordingly, the Government in consultation with the Commissioner of Labour decided to transfer the I.D.No. 25/2007 on the file of the Labour Court, Salem to Principal Labour Court, Madras to be heard in the I.D.No. 9/2007 on the file of the Principal Labour Court, Madras.

Revision of Minimum rates of wages for Employment in Public Motor Transport under Minimum Wages Act.

23rd July 2009.]

No. II(2)/LE/525/2009.—In exercise of the powers conferred by clause (b) of sub-section (1) of Section 3 and sub-section

(2) of Section 5 of the Minimum Wages Act, 1948 (Central Act XI of 1948) and in supersession of the Labour and Employment Department Notification No. II(2)/LE/597/2003, published at pages 353 and 354 of Part II-Section 2 of the *Tamil Nadu Government Gazette*, dated the 24th September 2003, the Governor of Tamil Nadu after consultation with the Advisory Board hereby revises the minimum rates of wages payable to the classes of employees in the employment in public motor transport, in the State of Tamil Nadu, specified in column (2) of the Schedule below, as specified in the corresponding entries in column (3) thereof, the draft proposal of the same having been previously published as required by clause (b) of sub-section (1) of Section 5 of the said Act.

2. This Notification shall come into force with effect on and from the date of its publication in the *Tamil Nadu Government Gazette*.

Explanations.—(1) Dearness Allowance.—In addition to the above basic wages, the employees shall be paid dearness allowance as follows:—

(i) The dearness allowance shall be linked to the Average Consumer price Index Number for Chennai City for the year 2000 (that is 475 points with base 1982=100) and for every rise of one point over and above 475 points, an increase of Rs.7.50 (Rupees Seven and paise Fifty only) per month shall be paid as dearness allowance.

(ii) The revision of dearness allowance shall be effective from the first April of every year on the basis of the average of the indices of the preceding twelve months, that is, from January to December.

(iii) The first calculation shall be effective from the date of publication of this Notification in the *Tamil Nadu Government Gazette* based on the Average Consumer Price index of the previous year.

(2) Where the nature of work is the same, no distinction in the payment of wages shall be made in the case of men and women employees.

(3) Where piece rate workers are employed in any public motor transport, the remuneration paid to each of them for a normal working day shall not be less than the minimum wages fixed for appropriate category.

(4) To arrive at the daily wages, the monthly wages shall be divided by 26.

(5) The 'wages' as defined in clause (h) of Section 2 of the Minimum Wages Act, 1948 (Central Act XI of 1948) shall be the criteria for the purpose of compliance of this Notification.

(6) Wherever the existing wages are higher than the minimum wages fixed herein, such existing wages shall be continued to be paid.
