## GOV RNMENT OF TAMIL NADU. ABSTRACT.

#### ORDER:

Centres in eight districts of the State and it is proposed to cover other districts also in a phased manner. The purpose of these centres is to provide all the basic services and support required by small and cottage industries under one roof. It has been brought to notice that the implementation of this important programme has been, to some extent, hampered by the necessity of obtaining a large number of clearances for setting up these small scale industries. The Programme Committee of the District Industries Centre which met on 20-2-1979 recommended that following the relaxations given by Government in G.O.Ms. No.291, Health and Family Welfare, dated 20-2-1979, the Director of Town and Country Planning should examine in consultation with the Inspector of Municipalities and the Director of Rural Development whether any parallel relaxations and concessions could be given so that the enterpreneur does not have to approach several departments for clearance. Accordingly the Director of Town and Country Planning has submitted the following proposals for consideration and orders of the Government.

- 2. The Director of Town and Country Planning considers that the entire State can be divided into three categories for purposes of technical scrutiny by his Department. He has also made necessary recommendations for the relaxation of the procedural requirements taking into consideration the characteristics of these categories. They are given below:-
- (i) Central and primary villages: The central and primary villages are mainly areas without any urban characteristics. They constitute the areas in the State not coming under (ii), (iii) and (iv) below. The Director of Town and Country Planning has suggested that there need be no restrictions on the location of the small scale industries in the central and primary villages from the planning point of view. He has, therefore, recommended that the application for small scale industries duly recommended by the District Industries Centre having jurisdiction over area need not be referred to the Director of Town and Country Planning Department for scrutiny. He has also suggested guidelines to be followed in the case of installations exceeding 25 H.P. as given in Annexure I to this order.
- (ii) Growth Centres and service centres: The areas covered by this category are given in 'nnexure I'to this order. Areas under the category shall be divided into two classifications viz.

- (1) industrial areas and (2) non-industrial areas. The Government have already issued orders in G.O.Ms.No.515, R.D.&L.A., dated 24-3-1979 permitting the grant of licence to installations upto 25 H.P. in industrial areas without reference to the Town and Country Planning Department. Hence the executive authorities of local bodies can grant permission for small scale industries recommended by the District Industries Centres for installations upto 25 H.P. without reference to the Town and Country Planning Department. For installations exceeding 25 H.P. the Director of Town and Country Planning has suggested guidelines as shown in Annexure II. In these cases, the executive authorities can grant licence based on the recommendations of the District Industries Centres subject to these guidelines. In respect of non-industrial areas, the executive authorities can grant permission upto 25 H.P. for industries recommended by the District Industries Centres without reference to the Town and Country Planning Department subject to the guidelines given in Annexure III. In the case of installation exceeding 25 H.P. in non-industrial areas, the executive authorities shall refer the applications recommended by the District Industries Centres to the Assistant Director of the Regional Directorate of Town and Country Planning who has been given delegation of powers.
- (iii) Growth poles: The Director of Town and Country Planning has recommended that in respect of growthpoles i.e. Corporation of Madras, Corporation of Madurai, all Special Grade Municipalities, all selection grade municipalities and all first and second grade municipalities, the existing regulations should continue in view of the need to prevent the haphazard growth and that the consult ation with the Director of Town and Country Planning is necessary.
- (iv) The Director has recommended that the last grade municipalities and the growth poles which are not municipalities have to be treated on the same footing as service and growth centres. He has recommended that the executive authorities of these areas can permit industries recommended by the District Industries Centre in industrial areas without reference to the Director of Town and Country Planning Department and in non-industrial areas only industries with a connected lead of 25 H.P. and above need be referred to the Town and Country Planning Department.
- (v) The Director of Town and Country Planning has also recommended that the above relaxations need not be made applicable to continuous process industries since they pose special problems requiring careful scrutiny. The District Industries Centre will be the competent authority to decide which industries come under these classification.
- 3. The Government accept the recommendations of Director of Town and Country Planning and direct that the relaxations shall come into force with immediate effect.

# GUIDELINES FOR GRANT OF INSTALLATION PERMISSION FOR INSTALLATION EXCEEDING 25 H.P. IN PRIMARY AND CENTRAL VILLAGES.

i. Permission	Authority for granting Panchayat Union permission for Township or Town factories and Panchayat as the installations. case may be.		
ii. Plans	Plans shall be submitt- ed indicating site location, and surrounding area for a distance of 100 metres, plan, elevation and sectional details and details of machinery.  Plans may be prepared by any qualified Civil Engineering Diploma holder or by the Extension Officer Town Planning (Pancha- yet Unions) as the case may be.		
iii. Site Suitability	i. The site shall be level as far as possible preferably with a gentle slope for smooth flow of drainage.		
	ii. Industries shall not be allowed within the minimum distance stipulated from the following institutions.  a. Educational Institutions 30 metres b. Hospitals. 50 metres c. Religious cum worship  Buildings 30 metres  5. Tanks and channels 15 metres.		
iv. *ccessibility	There shall be authorised public or private street in front with a minimum width of 7 metres		
v. Set back	For sites abutting National highways and State Highways, the front minimum set back of the building shall be 7 metres.		
vi. Working space	There shall be a minimum of 4 sq. metres of floor space for every working person and a minimum of 20 cu.m. breathing space for every working person.		
vii. Ventilation.	There shall be a minimum 0.5 sq. metres of opening leading to external air for every person employed.

viii. Chinneys

Chinneys of 15 metres height and above in the proximity of aerodromes and micro wave corridors shall be got cleared with the 'irport 'uthorities or Post and Telegraph.

ix.Loading, unloading and parking facilities.

Provision of space for loading and unloading of materials and backing of vehicles as may be required by Executive Officer/Fanchayat Union Commissioner.shall be provided.

x. Proximity of H.T. Lines.

No building shall be permitted beneath the H.T.line alignment unless sufficient safeguards are taken to the satisfaction

of the Blectricity Board Authorities.

XI. Timing.

The industry shall not be operated between 7 P.M. and 6 '.M.

GUIDELINES FOR GRANT OF INSTALLATION PERMISSION FOR INSTALLATIONS EXCREDING 25 H.P. WITHIN DECLARED INDUSTRIAL ZONES IN GROWTH CENTRES. SERVICE CHATRES (LISTED IN ANNEXURE IV) LAST GRADE MUNICIPALITIES AND GROWTH POLES WHICH TRENOT MUNICIPALITIES (LISTED IN ANNEXURE.IV).

i. Permission

Authority for granting permission for factories and install ations.

Town Panchayat, Township, Panchayat Union or Municipal council as the case may be.

ii. Plans.

Plans shall be submitted indicating site location together with the area around for 100 metres. plan elevation and sectional qualification details and details of machinery.

Plans shall be prepared by an Engineer who shall have a minimum of Diploma in Civil Engineering or 'rchitecture.

iii. Site Suitability.

The site shall be level as far as possible proferably with a gentle slops for smooth flow of drainage.

iv. a. Set back.

Minimum front open space 3 metres Minimum side open space on each side.

1.5 metres,

b. Plot coverage.

Not more than 50% of the site area shall be built upon

For sites abutting NH and SH the minimum front set back of the building shall be 7 metres.

v. Chimneys.

Chimneys of 15 metres in the proximity of aerodromes and micro wave corridors shall be cleared with the 'irport 'uthority or Post and Telegraph.

vi. Loading unloading and parking facilities.

Provision of space for loading and unleading of materials and parking of vehicles to the satisfaction of the permitting authority, shall be made.

vii. Proximity of H.T.Lines.

No building shall be allowed beneath the H.T.line alignment unless sufficient safeguards are taken to the satisfaction of the Dectricity Board Authorities.

i. Parmission

Authority for granting permission for factories and installations.

ii. Plans.

Plans shall be submitted indicating site location, and surrounding area for a distance of 100 metres, plan, elevation and sectional details with details of machinery.

Plans shall be prepared by an Engineer who shall have a minimum qualification of Diploma in Civil Engineering or 'rehitecture.

iii. Site suit ability.

i. The site shall be level as far as possible, preferably with a gently slope for smooth flow of drainage.

ii. Industries shall not be allowed within the minimum distance stipulated from the following institutions.

a. ducational Institutions 25 metres b. Hospitals 30 metres

c. Religious cum worship buildings

25 metres

d. Tinks and channels

10 metres.

iv. Extent The minimum extent of the site 250 sq.metres.

v. \*ccessibility. There shall be a public or private street in front with a minimum width of

10 metres.

vi. a. Set back

i. Minimum front open space

1.5 metres

ii. Minimum side open space on each side

1.5 metres.

iii. Minimum rear open spate

b. Plot coverage

Not more than 50% of the site area shall be built up.

For sites abutting National highways and State highways the front minimum set back of the building shall he 7 metres.

vii. Working space.

There shall be a minimum 4 sq.m. of floor space and a minimum of 29 cu.m. cubic space for every working person.

- viii. Chimneys. Chimneys exceeding &5m. m height in aerodromes and micro wave corriders shall be get cleared with the Airport Authority or Post and Telegraph.
- ix. Loading and Provision of space for loading and Unloading unloading of materials and parking and parking of vehicles to the satisfaction of the permitting authority shall be made.
- x. Proximity No building shall be allowed beneath of H.T.Lines. the H.T.line alignment unless sufficient safeguards are taken to the satisfaction of the Electricity Bo and Authorities.
- xi. Timing. The industry shall not be operated between 7 P.M. and 6 ^.M.
