ORDER:-

In his letter first road above, the Director of Municipal Administration has reported that according to Section 226 of the Tamil Nadu Panchayat Act, 1994 and Section 483 of the Madurai City Municipal Act, 1971, the taxes due to Fanchayats and Hadurai Corporation become time-barred for institution of suits and prosecution only after the lapse of 6 years. Article 62 of the Limitation money secured by mortage or otherwise charged upon immovable property. The Director of Municipal Administration has further stated that as the limitation of 3 years available in Section 345 of the Tamil Nadu District Municipalities Act is the short especially for the periods whenquinquennial revisions are taken place, he has requested the Government to raise the period of limitation from the present 3 years provided in Section 345 of Tamil Nadu District Municipalities Act either to 6 years as per the Tamil Nadu Panch yat Act, 1994 and Madurai City Municipal Corporation Act or 12 years as per Article 62 of the Limitation Act.

2. After careful examination, the Government have agreed to the proposal of the Director of Municipal Administration and decided to enhance the 3 years bimitation period prescribed in Section 345 of the Tamil Nadu District Municipalities Act to 6 years as provided in Tamil Nadu Panchayat Act, 1994 and the Madural City Municipal Corporation Act 1971.

3. Necessary legislation to amend Section
345 of the Tamil Nadu District Municipalities Act will
be brought separately.
