Sir/ Madam,

Sub: Implementation of Pay Commission recommendation, 2006 –Revision of Pensionary benefits of those who retired / died in harness after 01.01.2006 – Regarding.

 From the Accountant General (A&E), Chennai-18, letter No. A.G.(A&E) / Pension 30/ I / 1-74 / PCR / 2010- 2011 / 9168, dated; 21.04.2010.

In the Government letter first cited, Government has issued certain guidelines/ instructions for strict compliance in processing proposals relating to revision of pensionary benefits in respect of those retired between 01.01.2006 and 31.05.2009, one among them being the post audit of the pay fixation done by the Drawing & Disbursing Officers by the office of the Accountant General, to ensure the correctness of the pay fixation, so that, if any erroneous fixation is noticed, downward revision of pension and adjustment of excess payment in the last instalment of arrears to be paid could be effected.

- In the letter second cited, the Accountant General has informed that post audit of pay fixation done by the Departmental Officers is scheduled to begin in the first week of May 2010, preferably at District Collectorates.
- 3. I am, therefore, to request you to issue suitable instructions to all the subordinates under your control to produce the service books of the retired employees for whom revision was done electronically at the scheduled place and dates which would be communicated to you shortly as and when received from the Accountant General and to extend full co-operation to the Accountant General audit party for completing the task by December 2010.
