ORDER:

In the Government order read above, the terms and conditions for deputation of Government servants to various institutions were standardised. With reference to these terms, the Government servants deputed to Universities are not entitled for deputation allowance.

2. The Government have re-examined the question of allowing deputation allowance to the personnel deputed to the newly created Universities. They have to shoulder more responsibilities in the Universities and train the staff of the Universities within the limited period of deputation which is normally four years. Some incentive is, therefore, considered necessary to attract experienced Government officials to take up assignments in the Universities. The Government, therefore, direct that the personnel deputed to all the Universities in Tamil Nadu be eligible for deputation allowance at the rates indicated in para 3(i)(d) of the Government order read above, with effect from 9.2.1984.

3. Necessary amendments to Fundamental Rules will be issued separately.
